# CMC WEBSITE STATES:

The CMC will provide original or copy cataloging of eligible collections owned by Illinois Libraries that are system members.

Eligible collections will be cataloged free of charge. At the present time, eligible collections include genealogy, local history, and special collections (i.e., local authors, community cookbooks, government documents, etc.).

Eligible collections of material in most modern European languages can be accommodated. Uniqueness of material is also important.

# DOES MY ITEM QUALIFY FOR FREE CATALOGING?

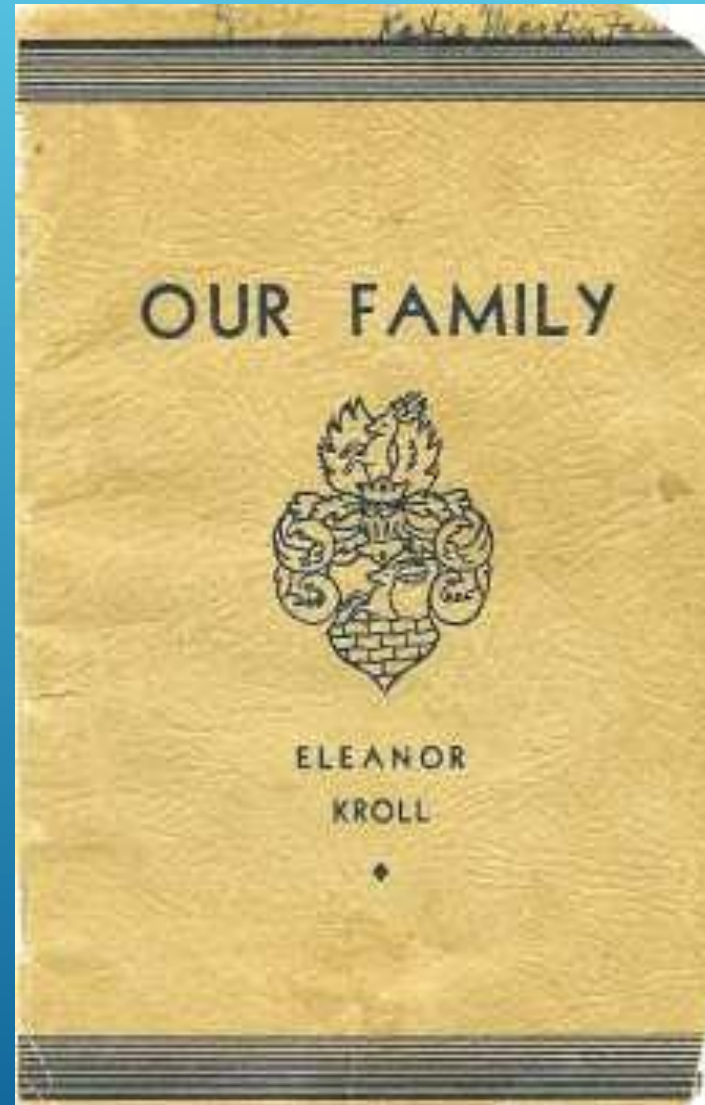
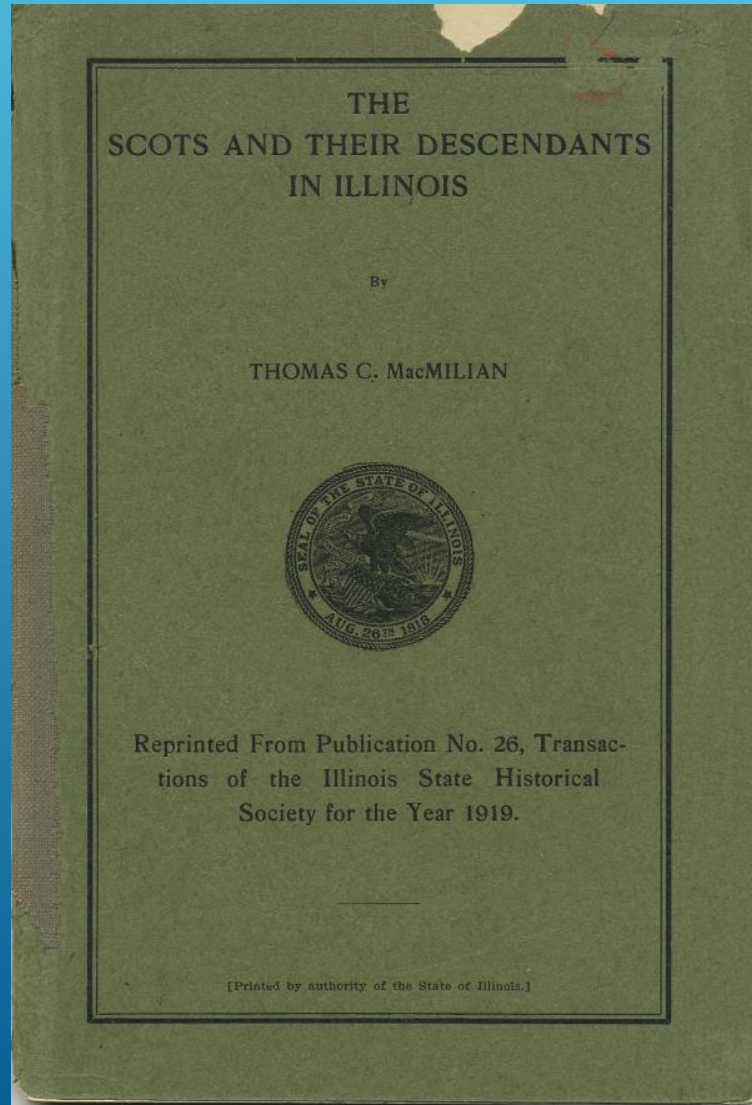
The items we are discussing in this presentation are for items that you own in your library and that reflect your community or have an interest for the State of Illinois.

The items do not represent the majority of your collection, but are a “special collection” held by your library for the benefit of your patrons.

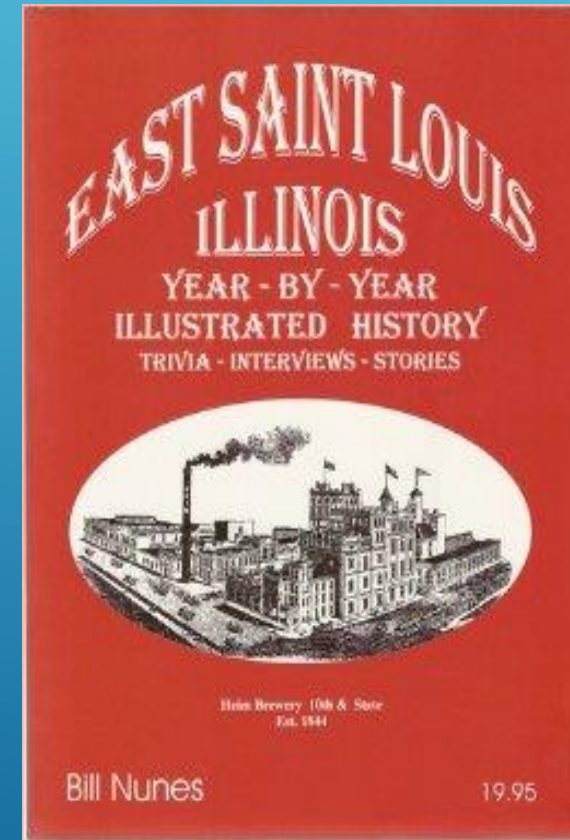
For example:

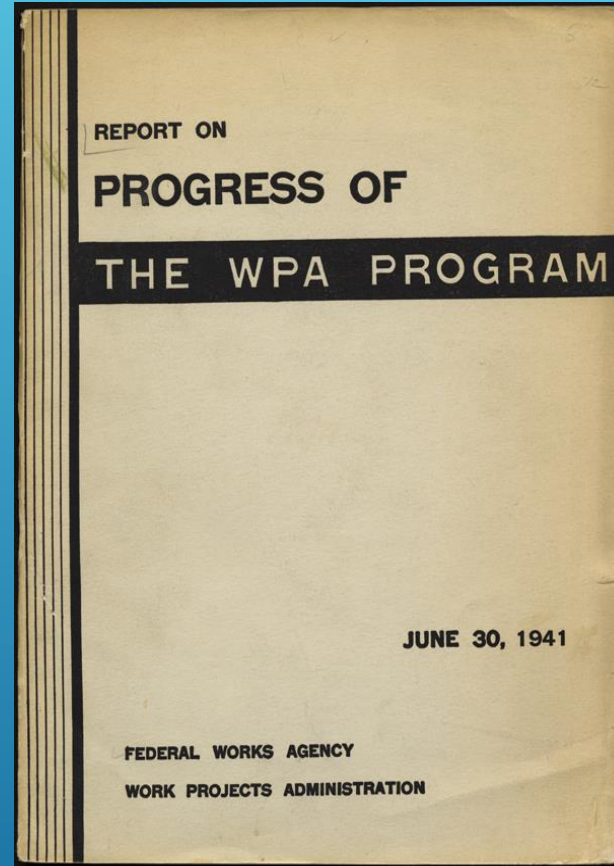
Worked and traveled in 27 countries and virtually every major city in the United States. He resides in Florence, South Carolina.

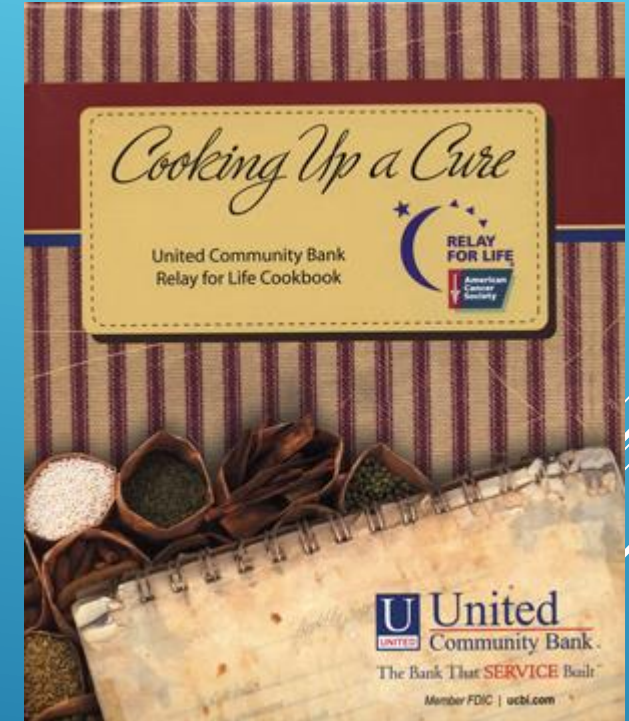
